Before You Bring a Puppy Home

Ask yourself:

Can I meet a puppy's needs 24/7 for the next few months? Who will handle toilet breaks, training, and sleep schedules? Is this the right season or would waiting be kinder for everyone?

A puppy **isn't** a gift. It's a 10- to 15-year commitment wrapped in fur and curiosity.

Safe space: pen, crate, or Gives security and prevents

quiet room overwhelm

Baby gates Manage freedom kindly

Bedding & blankets Comfort and warmth

Chews, lick mats, Kongs Outlets for teething/self soothing

Cleaning supplies Accidents happen

Collar, harness & ID tag Legal requirement and comfort

Vet registration & insurance Safety net from day one

Stock Up on Essentials

High-value training treats (chicken, hotdog, cheese)
Puppy complete food (check with breeder what they are feeding)
Long-lasting puppy suitable chews
Enzyme cleaner for toileting accidents
Food puzzles and enrichment toys
Contact info for local trainer / puppy class (force-free only)

_{zz} Plan the First Week

Keep visits and outings minimal — calm beats chaos
Gentle exposure to household sounds.
Feed, play, toilet, nap - on repeat.
Reward calm curiosity.
Remember: overtired = bitey.
Puppies need 18-20 hours of sleep a day.

Prepare Emotionally

Training is not linear - there will be accidents, nips, and tears. Consistency and kindness are the fix, not punishment. Give yourself grace - every guardian learns on the job.

Checklist
Safe rest area
Puppy-proofed rooms (wires, plants, shoes!
Treats & chews ready
Vet booked for initial check
Training plan for first few weeks

If the timing isn't right, wait. Puppies deserve calm, patient starts, not holiday chaos.

If you're ready, prepare well. You're building the foundation of a lifetime friendship.
